BEGINNING OF REVIEW NOTICE Three Certificate of Need Applications

Applicants, Project Descriptions, Estimated Costs:

<u>Sight Partners, LLC</u> is proposing to establish an ambulatory surgery center with two operating rooms at 16010 East Indiana Avenue in Spokane Valley [99216]. Services proposed to be provided are: ophthalmology. There is no capital expenditure associated with this project.

<u>Columbia Surgical Specialists, PS</u> is proposing to establish an ambulatory surgery center with four operating rooms at 217 West Cataldo Avenue, in Spokane [99201]. Services proposed to be provided are: ENT, colon and rectal surgery, general surgery, plastic surgery, gastroenterology, gynecology, maxillofacial, ophthalmology, oral surgery, orthopedics, pain management, pediatric dentistry, podiatry, and urology. There is no capital expenditure associated with this project.

<u>Iron Bridge Surgery Center</u> is proposing to establish an ambulatory surgery with five operating rooms at 1401 East Trent Avenue, #100 in Spokane [99202]. Services proposed to be provided are: urology. The estimated capital expenditure associated with this project is \$4,380,081.

Public Hearing: No public hearing will be held unless requested. To request a hearing, the request must be in writing and include the name, address, and signature of the person making the request. Deadline for requesting a public hearing is <u>Wednesday, March 16, 2022</u>. Faxed requests are not accepted.

If a public hearing is scheduled, the hearing notice will be published in the **Spokesman Review** at least 15 days before the date of hearing.
